
Thank you.

The Movement of Ideas remained in motion in 2021 because of your generous spirit. This past year was incredibly important for the cultural community in Kansas as doors reopened for safe and thoughtful gatherings around new museum exhibitions, compelling history presentations, book discussions, and other community events. Here to stay, online programming remained strong, and the monthly *Big Idea* essays and discussions flourished, adding richness and complexity to the Kansas story. Humanities Kansas received funding from the American Rescue Plan act to distribute to cultural organizations in our state and this modest infusion to more than 100 organizations provided much needed support and, perhaps equally important, acknowledged how important these places are in our civic society. HK launched innovative programming like the *Words of a Feather* do-it-yourself backyard birding and poetry project, the *Crossroads: Change in Rural America* initiative exploring local rural perspectives through a dynamic national touring exhibition from the Smithsonian Institution, and the *Humanities Hotline* that connected Kansans to one another through toll-free, bite-sized micro lectures. Whether done in person, on screen, or by phone, the humanities encourage us to engage and interact with one another. In fact, our democratic values depend on it.


The activities in this Annual Report were made possible because of the support HK receives from you. Enthusiastic local projects directors identified needs and leaned into HK programs, grants, and projects to connect with their communities. Humanities scholars went above and beyond to adjust their presentations to meet the needs of the day. Event participants did it all—adapted to Zoom, returned in person, took to the trails, and eagerly called the hotline to learn new things about our world. Together, we sparked conversations and shared ideas. The results, as you'll see in this report, are impressive. Yet, this work would not exist without generous donors whose contributions ensure that all HK events remain free and open to the public, in whatever format needed. As a Friend of Humanities Kansas, you saw the need and responded. The same is true for HK's board of directors and staff members who met every challenge.

Stories are at the heart of this work. Since our founding as an independent nonprofit in 1972, HK has used stories rooted in the humanities to spark fresh thinking and to help navigate uncomfortable conversations. Stories carry our culture; they educate and change us. They inspire and challenge us. They provide comfort in the familiar and encourage curiosity about the unfamiliar. FY 2021 Financial Overview

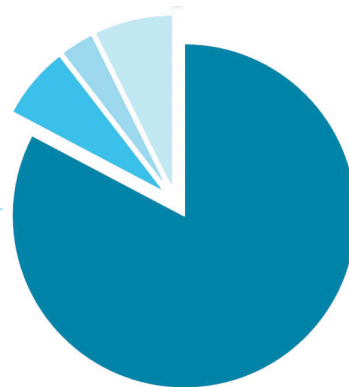
November 1, 2020 – October 31, 2021

HK receives income from diverse public and private sources. The National Endowment for the Humanities remained the single most important source of support in 2021, providing 83% of HK income. The private sector provided 7% and 7% was provided by other income, including investment income and miscellaneous income. The State of Kansas provided 3% of HK's support. In Fiscal Year 2021, Kansans contributed \$558,741.65 in Cost Share and In-Kind Services.

In 2021, HK received \$754,283 in relief funds from the *Sustaining the Humanities through the American Rescue Plan*, or SHARP, funds. These funds are included in the NEH and HK Program & Program Services categories.

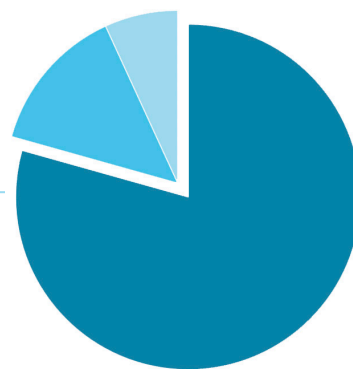

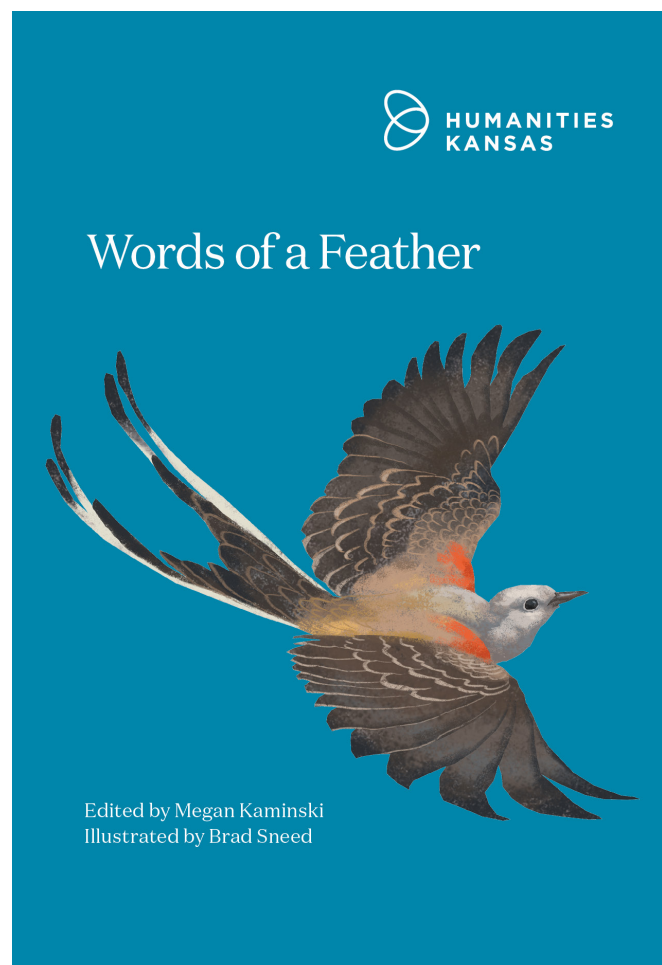
