DEAR FRIENDS,

There's no way around it: 2025 was a complicated year for Humanities Kansas (HK). The termination of our federal operating grant in April 2025 by the Department of Government Efficiency had a significant impact on our ability to support the public humanities in Kansas. Overnight, we lost 53% of our income that was intended to fund Humanities for All grants, Action grants, and other popular and important programming for and by Kansans. Decisions made by the board of directors and your willingness to offer critical financial support helped stabilize HK for the remainder of the year. Despite the disruption, this annual report continues the tradition of providing good news and documents the many ways the public humanities have made an impact on communities across Kansas. New local museum exhibitions, compelling history presentations, an exclusive Kansas tour of the *Americans* Smithsonian traveling exhibition, book discussions, and other community-centered events brought thousands of Kansans together. Across the state project directors saw local needs and made connections with HK resources. Humanities practitioners and cultural leaders drew connections between past, present, and future. And event participants did it all—hosted and attended events, went online to engage in *Big Ideas*, and gathered for conversations over books, Kansas history, poetry, and more. The results are deeply local and demonstrate an impressive sense of community among Kansans.

Since our founding in 1972, HK has valued the stories of Kansas, our nation, and our world to spark conversations that bring people together, strengthening our communities and our democracy. Challenges to our funding remain, but our commitment to Kansas is equally as strong. Thank you for continuing to support this important work.

## FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

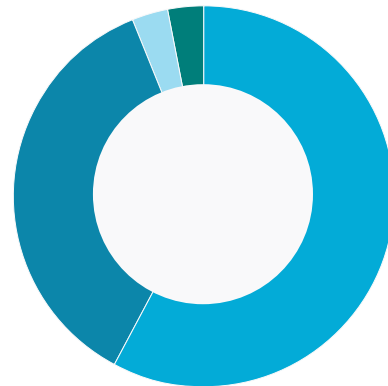
NOVEMBER 1, 2024 - OCTOBER 31, 2025

Humanities Kansas receives income from diverse public and private sources. The private sector provided 58% of HK income and the National Endowment for the Humanities provided 36%. An additional 3% was provided by other income, including investment income and miscellaneous income. The State of Kansas provided 3% of HK's support. In 2025, Kansans contributed \$1,151,399.60 in Cost Share and In-Kind Services.

Full audited financial statements prepared by SJHL accounting firm are available for review in the HK office.

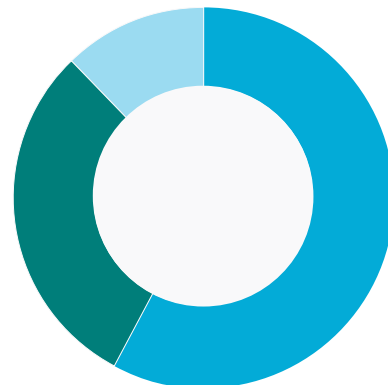

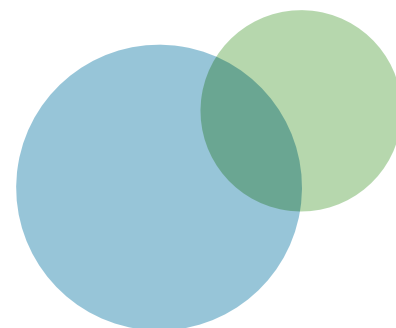

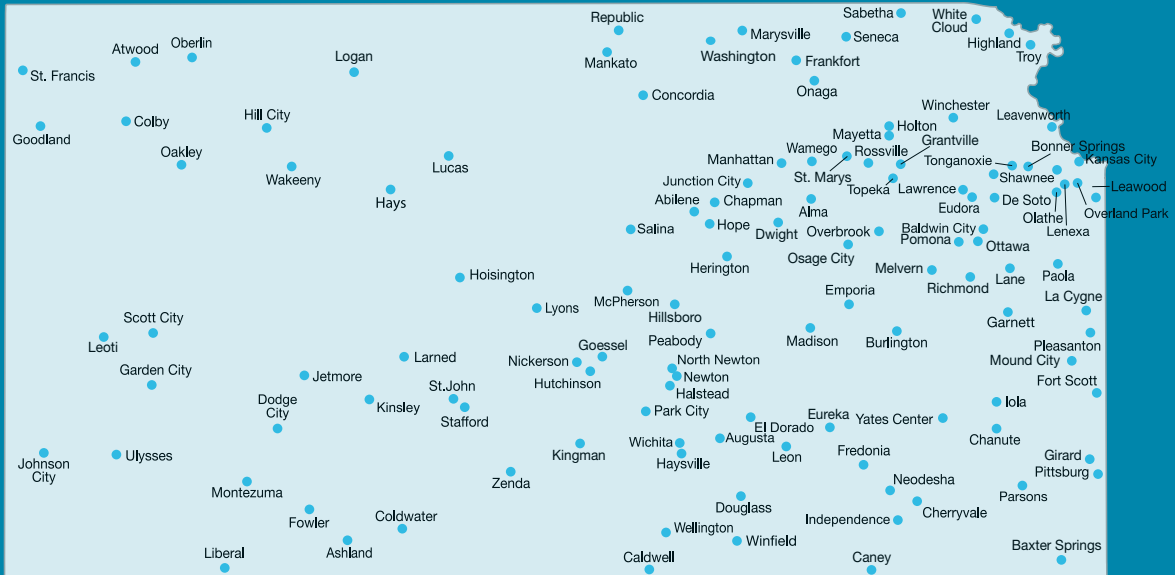
