NEH FUNDING MAKES THE HUMANITIES ACCESSIBLE TO ALL



NEH is an independent federal agency that supports the humanities in every state and U.S. jurisdiction. Since 1965, NEH has awarded more than \$6 billion to support local humanities programming, museums, historic sites, universities, teachers, libraries, documentary films, and public TV and radio stations.

NEH allocated \$9.1 million to Kansas between 2019 and 2023. This is a significant and important financial investment in our state that leveraged additional dollars and strengthened our economy.

NEH Strengthens Kansas Communities through Humanities Kansas

Together with statewide partners and supporters, HK draws on histories, literatures, and cultures to strengthen Kansas communities, our nation's democracy, and connections among Kansans. **In 2024, HK partnered with 251 organizations to present 488 free humanities events in 126 communities reaching 1 in 5 Kansans.**

NEH Provides Grant Opportunities to Kansas Colleges & Universities

Funding from the National Endowment for the Humanities supports innovative educational programs and research initiatives at colleges and universities in Kansas. Since 2019, Kansas State University, the University of Kansas, Newman University, Johnson County Community College, Wichita State University, Washburn University, and Highland Community College have received funding from NEH.

NEH Also Funds

- Family reading and literacy programs.
- Emergency and disaster relief to cultural institutions.
- Support for K-12 teachers and students.
- National History Day programs for students across the country.
- Life-saving programs for veterans that honor their service.
