
Dear Friends,

Grant inquiries increased by one-third, participants with wide-ranging perspectives began attending programs like never before, donors increased by 25 percent, nearly 50 new-to-us organizations booked our resources, and over 2,000 new followers engaged on social media and e-news. 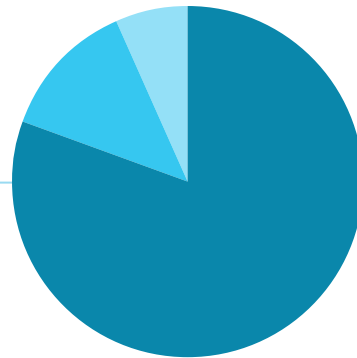
FY 2018 Financial Overview

November 1, 2017 – October 31, 2018

HK receives income from diverse public and private sources. The National Endowment for the Humanities remained the single most important source of income in FY 2018, providing 77% of HK revenues. The private sector provided 13%, with 7% coming from the State of Kansas. In FY 2018, Kansans contributed \$739,506 in cost-share and in-kind services.

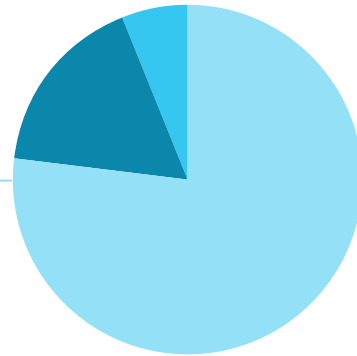
