Humanities Kansas is launching the 2021 Humanities Hotline on February 1, 2021 and is seeking 15 community cultural nonprofit partners to help reach local and regional residents who would most benefit from positive connection and cognitive engagement during the pandemic.

Humanities Hotline Partners receive one-of-a-kind promotional materials containing magnets, stickers, and flyers for distribution to local senior centers, departments of aging, health departments, meals on wheels distribution centers, assisted living facilities, as well as to walk-in visitors, patrons, and others who use your services. Partners will be recognized on the Humanities Kansas website and through other media outlets, and flyers will include your organization's name.

### Humanities Hotline Partner key responsibilities include:

- Connecting local senior citizens with the Humanities Hotline
- Promoting the Humanities Hotline with patrons, visitors, and community partners
- Promoting Humanities Hotline on social media, in newsletters, and other forms of communications

#### What is the Humanities Hotline?

The Humanities Hotline is a new tool for senior citizens to use to receive free, accessible micro-presentations about history and literature. In these complicated times, the Hotline keeps it simple: connecting Kansas by telephone. The three-minute hotline episodes cover interesting and important topics researched and presented by experts across the state. Topics change monthly with four different stories available each month.
